

RDHS March 20, 2023 Monthly Meeting Location: Marionville Community Centre

Mention was made of the ongoing membership renewal efforts by Linda Duhamel and the recent completion of the 2023 Yearbook by Jacqueline Wyss which document was distributed to all members.

Louise recapped the March Mini Flower Show and explained a how the categories were selected. The three categories were, Sugaring Time; In Honour of World Poetry Day (March 21st) and In Honour of International Women's Day (March 8th). A BIG thank you to all who participated. Louise encouraged attendees to vote for each of the 3 categories. She highlighted

how it was important when judging to bear in mind that the accessories for the arrangements were to accent the collection and are not intended to take over the whole arrangement.
